SELECTION CRITERIA

The number of students invited to participate in the Accelerated Achievers Program is limited. Students are selected through a progressive and comprehensive process. There are three main stages:

1

Applicants complete Accelerated Achievers Program (AAP) Application Form. This includes a form for parents/guardians to complete and a form for students to complete. One confidential reference from the applicant's current school should be completed and returned.

2

Applicants complete testing relating to academic ability. All testing will be conducted at Thornlie Senior High School.

3

Current school reports and student data, including NAPLAN, attendance, and behaviour information informs our final choice of participants in the Thornlie Senior High School Accelerated Achievers Program.
